ABOUT US

The National Youth Service was established in terms of the National Youth Service Act, 2005 (Act no. 6 of 2005). The mandate of the Service is to offer national service, technical and vocational training, personal development programmes and opportunities for voluntary services to the youth to enhance their employability, thereby contributing to socio-economic development and the alleviation of poverty in Namibia.

In a drive for self-sustainability, NYS is engaged in agricultural production for revenue generation and feeding of trainees. Revenue derived from these projects enables the Service to fund its programmes and fully utilize its assets.

NYS is engaged in rain-fed agronomic production, irrigated horticulture, poultry production (eggs), milling, dairy production and hay production.

POULTRY - EGGS



Agromony products (white and yellow maize) are produced under rain-fed irrigation at Rietfontein and Berg Aukas. Pearl millet (mahangu) is produced at Omauni under rain-fed irrigation.

Horticulture (vegetables) crops are grown at Berg Aukas, Rietfontein, Eunda, Henties Bay and Nauaspoort. Our primary vegetables are cabbages, onions, spinach, carrots, beetroots, tomatoes, watermelons and butternuts.

Hay production - blue buffalo (*cenchrus ciliaris*) bales are harvested at Rietfontein Farm

Poultry - NYS has about 4000 layer for egg production at Rietfontein. The daily capacity of eggs is about 3200.

Milling - value addition is done for agronomic products at Rietfontein. Currently white maize meal and mahangu are the two products

Diary - milk production is also done at Rietfontein with a monthly capacity of about 300 litres of cultured milk (omaere).
